



Title: Ribbon Flowers Mason Jar with Marilu Morency

Just add (the illusion of) water and this Mason jar floral arrangement will brighten up any room. This mixed media project provides a contemporary twist on traditional Silk Ribbon Embroidery. In addition to learning several ribbon embroidery techniques, students will also learn to create special effects by using a needle weaving technique, and by the specially arranged layering of materials.

In class, we will also discuss the juxtaposition of color and how to get those vibrant silks to pop even more!

Prior knowledge of basic stitches is helpful as a variety of stitches such as Backstitch, French Knots, and Stem Stitch will be used. Stitch diagrams and instructions will be provided.



Title: Wild & Woolly with Marilu Morency

The phrase Wild and Woolly came into being to describe the 'wild' west of the United States sometime after the Californian Gold Rush era and was popularized by a book titled, "Tales of the Wild and Woolly West," in 1891.

Now, we stitchers of the Wild West in the 21st century will explore using felted wool and wool felt to create a landscape from our imaginations. We will discuss elements of color and design as we cut and attach strips of fabric in a crazy quilt type of way, using a variety of stitches and threads. No two projects will be alike!



Title: Embellished Fabric Pendant with Marilu Morency

Transform small pieces of printed fabric into beautifully embellished wearable art.

Pattern and color placement will be covered prior to texturizing the piece with a variety of embroidery stitches.

Pendant construction, beaded edging, and application of findings will be taught, as well.

Students will be well on their way to creating handmade accessories suitable for gift giving and customizing wardrobes.
